

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Arrangements

- Odd number groupings work best
- Use the three, five or seven rule
- Use a statement piece
- Display your personality/character

Areas to Style

- Coffee tables
- Bookshelves
- Console tables
- Fireplace

CoffeeTable Must Haves

- Stack of books (no more than 3)
- Decorative boxes
- Bowls or Trays
- Fresh cut flowers
- Vase

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Mantel Must Haves

- Tall Vases
- Candlesticks
- Picture Frames
- Mirror
- Art

There are two kinds of balance you will want to achieve, symmetrical and asymmetrical. For a formal setting you would usually use the symmetrical layout of accessories.

A mirror in the centre with two other items either side but instead of flanking a vase in each side, think of grouping smaller items in groups of 3 or 5. So maybe a vase on one side and on the other, group items to balance it out

- Books
- Magazines
- Bookends
- Picture frames
- Ornaments
- Vases
- Flowers
- Bowls
- Trays
- Mementos
- Boxes/Baskets

A Tip on Choosing Artwork

Choosing art is a very personal thing and doesn't necessarily mean choosing something that goes with your colour scheme, especially if you are investing in a piece of art.

When hanging art the general rule of thumb is 57" (average eye level) from the floor to the middle of the painting i.e. gallery level
